DECISION

When these cases were called, Atty. Joventino Diamante, counsel for accused *Haber Amin Asarul and Camlian Borjal* reiterated their motion to have both accused re-arraigned in accordance with their plea bargain which was recommended for approval by the prosecution and eventually approved by the Ombudsman. Without any objection from Prosecutor Laguting, the Court directs the withdrawal of their previous plea of NOT GUILTY in these cases and orders their re-arraignment.


After being informed of the nature of the allegations in the Informations in Criminal Cases Nos. SB-15-CRM-0188 to 0210, both accused waived a full reading of the Informations in the said cases. When accused Asarul and Borjal were re-arraigned, after they had waived the full reading of the Informations, both entered a plea of GUILTY to the charges in the said cases.

When queried, accused and counsel informed the Court that the accused fully understood the nature and consequences of their entering a plea of guilty to the crime charged in the Informations.

WHEREFORE, judgment is hereby rendered finding accused Haber Amin Asarul and Camlian P. Borjal **GUILTY** beyond reasonable doubt of violating Sec. 2.81 of Revenue Regulations No. 2-98 in relation to Section 272 (b) of RA No. 8424. They are therefore each ordered to pay a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) in each of these cases, within ten (10) days from today. Otherwise, the Court shall issue a warrant for their arrest.

When accused Asarul and Borjal were re-arraigned, after they had waived the full reading of the Informations, both entered a plea of GUILTY to the charges in the said cases.

When queried, accused and counsel informed the Court that the accused fully understood the nature and consequences of their entering a plea of guilty to the crime charged in the Informations.

WHEREFORE, judgment is hereby rendered finding accused Haber Amin Asarul and Camlian P. Borjal **GUILTY** beyond reasonable doubt of violating Sec. 6 (b), in relation to Section 52 (b) of RA No. 8291, the lesser offense covered by the plea bargain. They are therefore each ordered to pay a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) in each of these cases, within ten (10) days from today. Otherwise, the Court shall issue a warrant for their arrest.
